From the Pastors.....

Romans 15:2-7:

2Each of us must please our neighbor for the good purpose of building up the neighbor. 3For Christ did not please himself; but, as it is written, "The insults of those who insult you have fallen on me." 4For whatever was written in former days was written for our instruction, so that by steadfastness and by the encouragement of the scriptures we might have hope. 5May the God of steadfastness and encouragement grant you to live in harmony with one another, in accordance with Christ Jesus, 6so that together you may with one voice glorify the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ. 7Welcome one another, therefore, just as Christ has welcomed you, for the glory of God.

Growing up, did you ever have times where you thought your parents would never stop saying things like: Remember to look both ways before you cross the street. Wear your seatbelt. Make sure your homework is done before supper. Wash your hands. Don't forget your mittens. Call me when you're on the way. Call me when you get there. They were these little reminders of things we take for granted during our daily schedules. We often do them, or don't do them, with very little thought. The reminders help bring to the surface again their importance and perhaps even trigger our brains to think about why we do these things instead of just going along on autopilot.

We hear similar reminders ringing in our ears from God's word in scripture --- those things that we read and hear and might think yeah, yeah I know, you've told me a million times but it doesn't hurt to hear it again. So, in Romans 15, we hear words like for the good purpose of building up the neighbor, grant you to live in harmony, together you may with one voice glorify God, and welcome one another just as Christ has welcomed you. We've heard them before, and hopefully we keep hearing them again and again.

Just like other things in our lives, it doesn't hurt to be reminded every once in awhile, to have our brains triggered to think about why we do the things that we do. Welcome others?! Well, yeah, I've heard that before. And, it's okay to hear it again. Why? Because it is a daily part of our life of discipleship that is manifested in so many ways. Take the beginning of Fall, for example:

Early in September, we had the great joy of welcoming new members into the life and ministry of this congregation and we gave voice to our rejoicing in our life in Christ together. Let us continue to welcome them to this community of faith in Jesus throughout the days to come. Welcome one another just as Christ has welcomed you for the glory of God.

Throughout our Sundays mornings, we've had the opportunity to wear name tags, and share fellowship with one another over muffins and coffee, and sing and pray together. Sharing our names and food and worship together is a gracious act of hospitality that radiates light and relationship. In this gathering of God's family, welcome one another just as Christ has welcomed you for the glory of God.

In the middle of this month, we will be welcoming a mother and daughter into God's family through the waters of baptism. It's a reminder of how, in all baptisms, the Christian community at worship gathers together as a visual sign that in baptism we are made one with Christ and with the whole people of God. On behalf of the whole church, we promise to support our new siblings, confess the faith with them, and welcome them into the body of Christ. Welcome one another just as Christ has welcomed you for the glory of God.

We will end the month of October by welcoming our 9th grade Confirmands into the continued lifetime journey of faith formation. We open ourselves to celebrate their affirmation of faith in our community and continue to extend our hearts and hands to them for the journey that is yet to come. In this celebration, welcome one another just as Christ has welcomed you for the glory of God.

As you remember and experience these times this Fall, we encourage you to think about moments of welcome in all the months that will follow. The handshakes, the hellos, the introductions, the check-ins. Reach out in big and small ways to one another just as Christ has reached out to you. Welcome one another not for yourself but for the glory of God. Be Christ's hearts and hands in this world welcoming one another for all of the big and little moments in the months ahead!

God's Work Our Hands Day of Service – September 10th

A big THANK YOU! to all the CIC members who participated in this year's "God's Work. Our Hands." Service project! CIC Members of all ages joined together to collect, sort, and pack 25 complete Welcome Kits, additional extra supplies, as well as color cards all for Lutheran Services Carolinas New Americans program.

It all started in August, when the CIC grocery cart "items of the month" included were tags listing needed items that would complete 4 different types of Welcome Kits: Dining Kit, Cooking Kit, Bathroom Kit, and Cleaning & Household Supplies Kit. A Thrivent Action Team card and a Seed Grant from the NC Synod helped support the purchases of 25 reusable tubs for storing the items, items for 5 generously supplied Hygiene Kits, and any additional items from the original tags that were not selected or weren't returned. After hearing a presentation from Wy-att Dunlap, LSC's Executive Director for the New Americans Program, on Sunday, on September 10th, ELCA's "God's Work. Our Hands." Sunday, an estimat-

ed 60+ CIC members worked to sort, pack, and load the Welcome Kits into vehicles to head to LSC's Salisbury office. Volunteers checked the contents of each box and children made festive welcome cards for each kit. Clean-up was a breeze, too, thanks to some CIC members who put away all the tables and chairs! What a great day of doing God's work with our hands!

It is important to mention that several members of the CIC Outreach Team and other CIC volunteers worked with each and folks from LSC to organize the event, some spending Friday afternoon setting up Fellowship Hall for the event! Thank you to everyone for donating supplies, helping pack, and aiding in the loading!

Finance Team

August financial gifts brought \$35.2k, again, lower than normal. We suspect this is still due to Members' late summer travel. Other Revenues brought in \$6.4k (bank interest, credit card rewards, Thrivent Choice dollars). Total Revenue YTD is \$46.5 which is 4% behind Budget. No unexpected expenses this month. We renewed the annual subscription to liturgical book resources, Purchased materials for the new year of Sunday School, paid fees for pastor substitutes. Electricity bill was high due to extreme heat in August, this recurs each year. Preschool conducted their annual CPR training for teachers. Total expenses for the month were \$56k. We ended August with a Deficit of \$9.5k and a combined YTD Deficit of \$22.9k. ~Madalyn Wilkinson, Director of Finance.
