

From the Pastors......

And on the seventh day God finished the work that he had done, and he rested on the seventh day from all the work that he had done. So God blessed the seventh day and hallowed it, because on it God rested from all the work that he had done in creation. Genesis 2:2-3

Happy Summer everyone! And yes, it is still very much Summer. We know the calendar has already turned to July, and July takes us on a downward trajectory towards August which is oh so close to September and the season of Fall. Regardless, right now, at this specific point in time, it is Summer.

Summer, in many ways, is our season of rest. Now, many of you might call us out for saying such a thing because for these 3 months you've got more going on than normal. You're out fiddling in the yard, you're venturing to baseball tournaments, you're attending weddings, you're playing in golf league, you're getting the kiddos to Day Camp, you're cruising around on Lake Norman, you're catching up with neighbors, and you're going to foreign lands like other countries or Ohio to vacation...there's lots of stuff happening during the summer, that's for sure. It's just, even though these summer activities can be busy and tiring, they also have the potential to be restful. They're restful because many of these summer events are different from what we've been doing for the rest of the year.

Summer becomes a necessary change of pace. It can be our seasonal Sabbath from what is done and experienced September-May. Given our geographical location, and the type of weather we regularly experience, we can get doses of this change of pace more often than others. Nevertheless, it is still tempting and common for us to cram as many activities and responsibilities into this 3-month window as possible which can result in this change of pace becoming more negative than positive—a highly unfortunate outcome, particularly considering that Sabbath rest is intended, by God, to help us rejuvenate and connect.

So, if on Monday morning, you're regularly dragging yourself out of bed, exhausted from your hectic schedule, you're not experiencing the Sabbath the way you're intended to. Likewise, if on Monday morning, you're spiritually drained, emotionally and internally struggling with the stressors of life and this world, you're not experiencing the Sabbath the way you're intended to.

The good news is that Summer isn't over yet. We suppose you can consider that to be a warning or an invitation (although we prefer it being an invitation!). That means, if you are exhausted from whatever it is you've been doing, reassess your agenda. Most importantly, if your connectivity to God is feeling lackluster, step things up! That's a crucial part of the gift of Sabbath – to spend time with God. If you can, get to worship in person or participate via livestream. Read scripture, PRAY!, do devotions, listen to hymns or Christian music in the car, volunteer somewhere...

The opportunity to rest and to be both physically and spiritually rejuvenated is here. But to truly experience the gift of Sabbath, one has to intentionally act upon it. God gives us time to rest, it's up to us to actually use the gift...and we definitely need to! Multiple, momentous events are occurring weekly these days: the horrific mass shootings in Buffalo, New York, and Uvalde, Texas; the ongoing war in Ukraine; the hearings of the January 6 committee; the decision of the Supreme Court to overturn Roe v. Wade; the ongoing pandemic; and all of the personal stressors we face. We need the gift of Sabbath to help us have the strength to work through the emotions and hard conversations that keep coming our way.

Sabbath time can and will be available once Summer has passed and we get into those other seasons. But as you know, lots of things can start filling our schedules during those months that make restful-wholistic-rejuvenation even more difficult. So, don't wait to enjoy the gift of this season—do it now! If you can, unplug from the typical day-to-day demands, take some time away, connect to God and, when Monday(s) rolls around, be as refreshed as possible and ready to continue the work that God has called you to that lies before you.

Finance Page

May brought in \$45.1k in financial gifts, for a year-to-date total of \$467.5k (4% behind YTD budget). We had no unusual spending this month. We paid for landscaping and pruning around the property (\$830), renewed our bulk postage permit (\$265), made a quarterly copier 'actuals' pmt (\$555) replenished office supplies (\$393). Since there was no regular preschool tuition coming this month, our standalone result is a deficit of \$-10.1k. YTD we are still in a surplus position at \$22,252. \sim Madalyn Wilkinson—Finance Director


