From the Pastors.....

I give you a new commandment, that you love one another. Just as I have loved you, you also should love one another. By this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another.

John 13:34-35

Waaaaay back in the day, when we were young, filled with energy, and had quite a bit more patience, we spent our summers working as camp counselors at Camp Agape. One of the things we would routinely do, on the first night of a new week at camp, was to gather our cabin together to discuss the “Cabin Covenant.” The Cabin Covenant was an agreed upon framework for how we would function together as a group that week. Instead of us, as the Counselors, telling the 8-17yr olds what the “rules” were going to be, there was conversation about it. The kids got to name what they felt was important and what guidelines were needed for all of us to have the best possible experience together. This process created greater buy-in from the entire cabin as well as more natural accountability. We, as a group, crafted the rules and we, as a group, agreed to live by and enforce them.

Those pre-teens grasped what the drafters of the U.S. Constitution and Bill of Rights also recognized. One cannot simply quote Jesus’ “do to others as you would have them do to you” and assume people will appropriately fall in line and things will go just fine. There needs to be more specifics. Jesus’ teaching can certainly provide the basis, but humans, being the sinners that we are, need additional structure and details to go off of, which is what the drafters sought to provide. Inspired by Judeo-Christian teachings, Enlightenment thinkers, and a range of other sources, the drafters, representing all the colonies, collaboratively worked together to create our country’s foundational documents. Wise enough to know that there would need to be changes at points, and to give later generations a voice in the covenant, the possibility to add amendments was included. These documents continue to ground our shared life together, and each new era of citizens agree with them and/or can voice ways in which they need to change.

When citizens or elected officials do things out of bounds of these laws, it is our civic responsibility to hold them accountable. If that doesn’t happen, just like a cabin full of kids, the structure which holds us together erodes and, predictively, not good things will follow. Because of the toxic polarity of our current two-party political system, attempts at accountability, for example, when due process has not been granted in the recent deportations of migrants to El Salvador, can be seen as partisan attacks. They’re not. They are a recognition that the promises we have made to one another are not being upheld and that they need to be corrected. This should not be controversial but, alas, here we are.

Jesus never told us what form of government we should have. He just commanded us to love one another as he loved us. Knowing our sinful tendencies, and humanity’s past track record in following the law, Jesus left us to collaborate upon the details. That’s the tried-and-true way for people to have the best level of buy-in and accountability. And while what we, and those who have gone before us, have come up with for our government is far from perfect, elements of Jesus’ compassionate, inclusive love can be found within it ... and whenever that love and care for people is missing, we work to fix it, not to make a political statement, but a response to our faith. And, putting our partisan biases aside, we all have work to do.

What is Agapé Day Camp? Agapé Day Camp is run through the summer programming at Agapé † Kure Beach Ministries, an outdoor ministry of the NC Synod. The counselors travel to us to lead the campers in songs, games, Bible Studies, nature activities, crafts, and both Biblically- based as well as silly skits. They bring outdoor ministries to us! The Middle School program is an opportunity for youth to grow and give back to the community. Agape provides team building exercises and challenges while the congregation arranges at least three service-learning opportunities (TBD and likely off-site) throughout the week.

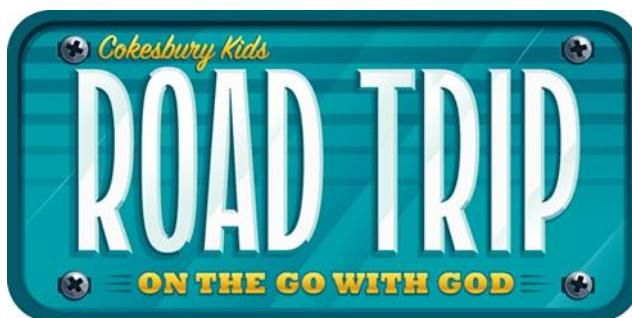

Finance Page

March gifts brought in \$51.4k, a very good result. We are now ahead of our Budget goal for Member Contributions, and ahead of the bottom-line deficit. Preschool continues with 42 kids enrolled; 2 months remain in the regular school year. We have 45 students enrolled for the 2025-26 school year. Registration for Summer Camps is open and there are spots available. Please spread the word to friends and neighbors about our fantastic camps. This month, one of our long term CDs matured bringing in \$2.1k in interest income. Designated Thrivent Choice dollars continue to come in. A huge thank you to the members for taking advantage of this opportunity to benefit CIC. YTD Revenues are at \$545.8k (PY \$520.9k). Expense items of interest: Altar supplies (Wine and Bread) \$150; Stewardship Envelopes \$135; Synod Benevolence \$5.1k; Quarterly Mileage Reimbursement: \$390; Fire/Security: \$1.1k, included Annual Wet Sprinkler inspection, Antifreeze test, Backflow Test; Lawn care: \$900; Utilities - Electric: \$2.7k; Music – A/V Maintenance: \$380, E-camm streaming software subscription renewal; Additionally, we used \$0.7k for final mold remediation repairs in Pastor Lisa's office. We used \$1k from PY IN money to cover PL's Greece travel fees and \$1.5k from PY OUT money for donations to various organizations (LCS refugee cause, Lutheran Disaster Response, Angels & Sparrows, Bishop Tim gift). YTD Expenses are \$531.4k (PY \$526.1k). Our YTD Surplus now stands at \$14.3k.~Madalyn Wilkinson, Finance Director
