Welcome, Reverend Dr. Marcus Miller! Pastor Miller will lead CIC in worship on Sunday, April 7th. Pastor Miller was born and raised in Southgate, MI (a Detroit suburb) where his father was a Lutheran pastor and his mother an elementary school teacher. He served in five calls from 1971-2012: teacher of religion and German at Martin Luther High School in Maspeth, New York (1971-73), Pastor of Immanuel Lutheran Church, Mt. Vernon, NY (1973-79), Pastor of the Lutheran Church of the Good Shepherd, Brooklyn, OH (1979-95), Bishop of the Northeastern Ohio Synod, ELCA (1995-2006), and President of the Lutheran Theological Southern Seminary, Columbia, SC (2006-12) while Pastor Lisa and Pastor Michael were students. From November 1, 2013 until August 31, 2014, he was the Interim Bishop of the Northeastern Ohio Synod upon Bishop Eaton's election as Presiding Bishop of

the ELCA. He has served numerous congregational interims in his retirement including here at CIC. Pastor Miller supports and encourages various ministries of social justice and compassion both during his time as a parish pastor and a synod bishop and now in retirement. Pastor Miller and his wife, Katherine, a retired Registered Nurse and Middle School Band Director, live in Huntersville. They have two children and five grandchildren they are happy to share about!



We welcome Bishop Tim Smith, Bishop of the NC Synod, as he visits CIC on Sunday, April 21st! Bishop Tim will preach at both services and will gladly join you in conversation around the coffee cart in the narthex between services. Born 1960 in Lenoir, NC, Tim graduated high school in Salisbury, NC, in 1978. He played JV basketball under Coach Roy Williams and was musical director of the Clef Hangers at the University of North Carolina-Chapel Hill, graduating in 1982. He then attended Gettysburg Seminary, including a semester in Washington, DC at Catholic University and an internship at The American Church in Berlin, and graduated in 1986. He received a D.Min degree from Drew University in 1992 and served three parishes—

St. Paul-Startown (Newton, NC), Grace (Boone, NC), and Redeemer (Atlanta, GA)—before becoming bishop. Tim is married to Wendy Weisner Smith and they have three grown children and six young grandchildren.

From the Pastors.....

Then God said to Moses, "Come no closer! Remove the sandals from your feet, for the place on which you are standing is holy ground." Exodus 3:5

It's a place. It's a very special place for us and for countless others. And a few weeks ago, we learned that that place, the Lutheran Theological Southern Seminary, will be closing its historic campus in Columbia next year and moving to Lenoir-Rhyne University's campus in Hickory, NC. While we can rationalize that LTSS's campus on Main Street is just a combination of buildings on a plot of land, and that the deepest value of LTSS derives from the people connected to it and the mission it embodies, it still deeply grieves us that LTSS's historic location will soon be closed.

The decision, as painful as it was, is the right one. All the data, whether it be the continually declining on-campus enrollment, to the exorbitant cost of maintaining the campus, to the shifting of how theological education is done...it all points to the need for the move to happen. And yet, we and so many others are grieving.

LTSS is a place where we learned Koine Greek, the original language of the New Testament. It's a place where we gathered for weekly cookouts with classmates and families. It's a place where we delved into trivial conversations about sports and the weather. It's a place where perspectives on ethics and justice were challenged. It's a place where we lived while we were engaged and first married. It's a place where we played flag football and ultimate frisbee with friends. It's a place where we worshipped and prayed daily in the chapel...the chapel we would be ordained in together. It's a place that helped to form us as pastors. In fact, it's the place where all of Community In Christ's former pastors went to seminary.

While there is some truth to the adage, "places are just places," we all have particular locations scattered across our lives that mean more to us than others do. There's a sacredness to them. They're the places that are packed with memories, formation, and love...places where God has been at work in tangible ways. They are holy ground.

What are your places? Churches? Schools? Playgrounds? Gyms? Trails? Homes? Are they locations that you can still get to and experience? Or, because of some circumstance, are you no longer able to physically experience them?

As has been shared alongside the news of LTSS's pending move, Columbia was not actually the seminary's original location. It was first established in Pomaria, SC, in 1830. This historical footnote can be quickly glossed over. With eyes of faith, the added piece of information can be seen as a nod to God's continued work. God is never stagnant.

While this current point in LTSS' history has a heavy "Good Friday" vibe to it, the cross and tomb are never where we stay. As such, we hold these feelings of loss that this move creates for us in tension with our joy-filled trust in the hope of resurrection that comes from Christ.

Nothing ever replaces those special places that we experience throughout life, but as God continues to journey alongside us, new places become sacred because God is made known to us in those places. From Mt. Sinai, to Jerusalem, to Bethlehem, to Philippi, to Rome, to Wittenburg, to Columbia, to Hickory, to Cornelius...holy ground doesn't stay put. God is on the move and so, too, is the promise of love and life.

Finance Team

February gifts brought in \$44.3k, YTD Contributions stand at \$323.8k. I would like to personally thank all those who have already responded to the recent Council Giving Appeals. We have a little way to go still, but we are seeing positive upward trending signs. Each individual gift is noted, and please know, that thanks to YOU, the Congregation is able to thrive and continue with the Lord's mission! CIC Preschool has started enrolling children for the next school year (40 enrolled) and summer camps (20-27 enrolled depending on session). Please spread the word to friends and neighbors about this wonderful school. We continue to bring in interest income, credit card cash back rewards and Thrivent Choice dollars, \$800 this month, \$3k YTD. Total Revenues as of February were \$441.9k. On the expense side, we made one time contributions to our employees' HSA accounts (\$4.8k), we prepaid for the upcoming summer Campfirmation (\$2.2k), in regular ongoing spending we paid \$2.8k for electricity, 1.2k for AC inspection and maintenance, \$770 for computer/software related expenses. We used \$8.7k from Capital/Emergency funds to pay for the replacement of a broken AC/heating unit in the Office building. We ended the month with a \$1.7k deficit. Our YTD Deficit is \$24.1k.~Madalyn Wilkinson, Director of Finance.
