

From the Pastors......

For everything there is a season, and a time for every matter under heaven. ~Ecclesiastes 3:1

Our "Wonky Fall." That's what we declared the Fall of 2024 practically a year ago ... and we didn't even know then how wonky it would actually get.

First in place, Pastor Michael has been asked for several years now to return to his internship congregation, Bethany Lutheran Church in Boone, for their homecoming Sunday. It has always fallen on Reformation Sunday, so he has had to decline given the ministry happenings occurring here at CIC. Then, last Fall, they came back with, "What if we changed it to October 20th next year? Could you come?" He was delighted to say yes! A week later, the 2024 Men's Retreat was scheduled for the Sunday of October 13th. This is when we started calling it the "Wonky Fall" since Pastor Michael would be gone for 2 Sundays in a row in the middle of October.

In early May, Pastor Lisa's childhood congregation approached her asking her to return "home" for a Sunday to preach as part of their Fall of celebrating their 60th Anniversary. She looked at the "Wonky Fall," and the beginning of the program year, and went "huh" for a bit. But, then we decided that lifting up their role in building her as a leader in the church is definitely worth adding to the wonkiness. If you're keeping track, that's a 3rd Sunday.

Through it all, we'd had our eyes on the weekend of October 6th. Pastor Michael has a big birthday the next day ... and his dream was to go to a home Ohio State football game on October 5th. The stars aligned when the football schedule finally came out. We are grateful for Pastor Sara's ability to return that Sunday and also for her love of Ohio State. If you're keeping track, that's a 4th Sunday ... but only the first the impacts both of our presence.

The Wonky Fall! Usually, once the program year begins, it's the straight-lined sprint toward Christmas. But, this year, we're embracing the wonky. We even got to add to it with a family medical emergency in the mix! (A 5th Sunday impacted!) As people who mark their weeks by Sundays, it has been quite the change and adjustment ... and it has also been a blaring reminder that God's timing, Kairos, and our normal timing, Chronos, are not always the same thing.

Kairos is mentioned 86 times in the New Testament many times referencing God's work in Jesus as either happening or that it is not yet the right time. Kairos is a time of rightness. It can't be hurried, delayed, or scheduled. It can be thought of like the process of fruit ripening. You can't hurry it up to meet your schedule and you can't tell it that time is up and it needs to be done.

Kairos reminds us that not everything can be predicted, not everything can be scheduled, and not everything happens in the sequence that makes the most sense to our chronological or practical mindsets. The straight-lined sprint to Christmas has pit stops this year filled with God's presence, God's peace, God's healing, and God's celebration! The calendar looks different than it has other years and yet it is so ripe with the fruits of God's presence that our baskets are full with plenty to share.

We are grateful to live in this "Wonky Fall" with you, to embrace Kairos in all of our midst, and to share in team ministry that allows for confident "yeses" responding to God's call that we can't always predict! Thanks be to God for God's movement in all of our lives in scheduled and unscheduled ways!

The children made quick work of assembly containers that will surely bring smiles to others' faces when the day comes. Clean-up was a breeze, too, thanks to some CIC members who put away all the tables and chairs! What a great day of doing God's work with our hands!



Finance Page

We are two months into the new fiscal year and things are still moving slowly. August financial gifts brought in \$37.8k, YTD \$72.6k. We are 3% behind the Budget at this point, which is not abnormal for the summer months. However, we do encourage Members to utilize remote giving options when away from CIC. Preschool wrapped up Summer Camps with a total of \$10.2k in camp tuition revenue. YTD they are at \$10.7k. September will bring the start of the regular school year. We have 45 students enrolled, 5 fewer than we budgeted for, so we expect to fall a bit short of the Budget goal. Please share with friends and neighbors that we have spots open in the older classes, 4s, PK and TK. Other Revenues (bank interest, facility use fees, Thrivent Choice) stands at \$1.1k YTD. Total Revenues YTD are \$84.3k.

Expenses this month included Pastor Substitute fees, pre-registration for our Pastors' retreat, annual fee for Carbonite computer backup, annual subscription for Sundays & Seasons liturgical readings and online hymnal, semi-annual AC inspection and maintenance, regular lawn care, and mulch for the playground. Total Expenses for the month were \$55.1k, YTD \$110.6k. Additionally, we used \$9.7k of Capital/Emergency funds to pay for parking lot resurfacing.

We ended August with a Deficit of \$11.7, YTD Deficit is \$26.2k. This is similar to where we were at this point last year, so we are not despairing, but we hope things improve as the year goes on. \sim Madalyn Wilkinson, Finance Director
