Sunday, February 2nd & 9th - Souper Bowl of Caring

What is Souper Bowl of Caring? It's an annual event where communities come together, inspired by the Super Bowl, to tackle hunger locally. For over three decades, the Souper Bowl of Caring has empowered individuals, or-ganizations, and schools to raise food and funds for food banks and community-based charities. Tackle Hunger is a national nonprofit that mobilizes communities across the U.S. to fight food insecurity through its grassroots, youth -driven fundraising events that support any local food charity. Since its humble beginnings in 1990, the organization has raised over \$198 million in food and funds, directly benefiting local hunger-relief charities. On Sundays, February 2nd and 9th, a special offering will be collected as we'll be participating in Souper Bowl of Caring for Angels & Sparrows in Huntersville. How does it work? Three "soup bowls" will be in the narthex on February 2nd and 9th . Place your donation in the bowl of the team you would like to win or are predicting will win this year's Super

Bowl. An update on which team is in the lead will be given between Sundays. You can choose to place your donation in one of the Super Bowl "teams" bowls. Whether you will be cheering for either the *Philadelphia Eagles*, the *Kansas City Chiefs*, the *Commercials*, Angels & Sparrows is an organization we can all get behind! *We encourage check and cash donations when possible to help our counters. From the Pastors......

Lord, when was it that we saw you hungry and gave you food, or thirsty and gave you drink, or a stranger and welcomed you...? Then he will answer them, 'Truly I tell you, just as you did it to one of the least of these, you did it to me.' -Matthew 25:39-40

1727. That was the year Nicholas Beery immigrated to Pennsylvania from Switzerland. Like so many who have journeyed to America, Nicholas and his family didn't exactly come here by choice. No, they left luscious farm land and vibrant, loving communities out of pure necessity. They were persecuted. At that time, the Beerys (or Bieris) were Mennonites and because of their understanding of the teachings of the New Testament, they would not participate in the military nor would they take any oaths of allegiance to the Swiss government. These views, as well as numerous others, conflicted with the Reformed Church which was the predominant religion of that region of Europe. As such, the Mennonite community became subject to a deprivation of their rights—there were arrests, imprisonments, heavy fines, forced military service, and eventually all businesses, farms, and property were confiscated by the government. The Beerys and their friends and neighbors became homeless.

After several short stays in places around Europe, Nicholas and many from his community had the opportunity to come to America. Grateful for that chance, he, his family, and hundreds of others boarded a ship called the Friendship and set sail for what they hoped to be a fresh start.

The Beerys first settled into life in Pennsylvania but, over time, Nicholas' people gravitated westward to the great land of OHIO and, after a period of intermingling with largely German communities, many converted to Lutheranism. That's a very abbreviated retelling of part of Pastor Michael's family history—if you're curious about hearing more, you know he'd be more than happy to fill you in later.

Pastor Lisa's family's immigration story(s) isn't all that different from Pastor Michael's ... except they are overwhelmingly Scandinavian and in the late 1800s. These stories probably aren't all that different from many of yours. Whether forced to immigrate or trying to escape extreme poverty and stagnate futures, many of your American origins have "Nicholas Beery" undertones.

In the most optimal of situations, today's immigrants and refugees would probably choose to stay with their families, in their communities, in their countries...but for the vast majority of them, they don't have a choice. Out of necessity, they are fleeing.

It's a disheartening, yet familiar pattern. A pattern many of our ancestors have experienced. A pattern our God has even experienced. You may recall that shortly after Jesus' birth, Joseph took the Holy Family to Egypt to escape from a massacre brought on by King Herod. They needed safety that could not be found within their homeland and they found that shelter through a neighbor.

When it comes to immigration and refugees, God gets it. God understands the desperation. God understands the fear. God understands the need. That's why it should come to no surprise that one of the most repeated commands throughout scripture is for us to welcome—welcome the "stranger" or welcome the "other..." For those people that seemingly have no place of their own we are to do what we can to give them a place.

Lutherans, who have predominantly come to the United States through waves of immigration from Europe, have placed this command of welcome as a paramount practice in our faith. Currently, Global Refuge (formerly Lutheran Immigration and Refugee Service) is the second largest resettlement agency in the U.S. Since World War II, Global Refuge has helped nearly a million immigrants and refugees rebuild their lives!

It certainly appears that this sacred work of welcoming is going to be much more difficult for us to participate in, at least from a national level. There are a range of challenges currently happening, however, one of the most pressing involves caring for immigrants who have recently entered the United States. These are individuals and families who have gone through a thorough vetting process (sometimes taking multiple years) and are legally in the U.S. at the invitation of the government. Federal funding to aid in their transition and integration into life here has been frozen. This jeopardizes and hinders their ability to receive ESL classes, employment training, school tutoring, and extended cultural orientation which will help them in thriving in life in this new home. And, these are people we have already been assisting by participating in LSC's New Americans program.

All of this, again, makes us think of Nicholas Beery. Nicholas' entry into America in 1727 occurred long before Lady Liberty was stationed off our shore inviting the tired, poor, homeless, huddled masses who were, "yearning to breathe free." Even still, I can't help but wonder, "What would life be like for us if we were not welcomed here?" What would life be like for you if your family were not welcomed here?

Now, if your current concern with immigration/refugees is with the safety surrounding who is allowed entrance into the country and who is not, we commend to you a few resources and additional items to ponder:

This concise video offers insight into how people are entered into the refugee status process. Here's the LINK.

Lutheran Services Carolinas is the "boots on the ground" doing this work of welcome in the Carolinas. Since October, LSC has welcomed 400 refugees to North and South Carolina. LSC is able to continue serving these newly arrived neighbors using donated dollars only. Follow the link to contribute to this ministry or to learn more about legal refugee status and the ways LSC is able to help over 80% of the families become self-sustaining within 6 months of arriving in the U.S. Here's the *LINK*.

After almost 300 years since Nicholas Beery's arrival to America, there's really no way of telling how Nicholas' neighbors treated him upon his arrival. If history is any indication, he and his family were likely, sadly, not overwhelmingly greeted with "open arms." Regardless, Nicholas, as well as all our ancestors, still received entry into the "golden door" of Lady Liberty. And, in time, they also came to experience the love, joy, compassion, and freedom that the United States has striven to offer.

That's at least how our story goes. And that's probably quite similar to how many at CIC's story goes, too. The question is, what about their story? What about the current immigrants and refugees who are fleeing whatever horrible things they've desperately tried to get away from? What about them?

God calls us to be a welcoming people—to reach out to the lost, to the vulnerable, to the "other," to those that need "a place." There have always been obstacles to overcome in order to follow this command. Whatever those obstacles may be, it doesn't change what we're called to do. And, remember, whenever we do welcome others in such a way, we not only care for our many neighbors, we care for Christ himself.



Hurricane Helene

Lutherans have been active in Western North Carolina all Fall trying to help those in the area recover and rebuild from Hurricane Helene. If you want regular updates on what our wider church is doing, and seeing glimpses of how you can help, be sure to regularly check the NC Synod's social media accounts and website as well as Lutheran Disaster Response Carolina's Facebook page and blog. Here's just a sampling:

Lutheran Disaster Response was awarded a \$2 million (yes, you read that correctly!) grant from the Emergency and Disaster Response Fund (EDRF) from The Community Foundation of Western North Carolina to support their Bridging Together partnership with Mennonite Disaster Service. The Community Foundation of Western North Carolina also awarded Lutheran Services Carolinas (LSC) a grant of \$25,000 from its Emergency and Disaster Response Fund to help cover hurricane-related expenses. This grant has helped defray the cost of generator fuel, water deliveries in large tanker trucks while water was unsafe, and portable handwashing stations and toilets. LSC has worked diligently to make sure residents and clients are safe.

Lutheridge has acquired a portable lumber mill to turn fallen trees into usable lumber to rebuild and create new structures and signage all around camp. "The same trees that have stood watch over camp for generations will continue to provide shelter and hope for campers and guests. Thanks be to God!"

Congregations from around the NC Synod, including ours, have provided requested supplies to distribution sites as well as sent volunteers to help places like Lutheridge get to a place of being not only open for retreats but also being hubs for helpers.


Sunday School




What is Agapé Day Camp? Agapé Day Camp is run through the summer programming at Agapé † Kure Beach Ministries, an outdoor ministry of the NC Synod. The counselors travel to us to lead the campers in songs, games, Bible Studies, nature activities, crafts, and both Biblically- based as well as silly skits. They bring outdoor ministries to us! The Middle School program is an opportunity for youth to grow and give back to the community. Agape provides team building exercises and challenges while the congregation arranges at least three service-learning opportunities (TBD and likely off-site) throughout the week.

Preschool Registration for 2025/2026: Priority registration begins on January 27, 2025, for currently enrolled students, siblings, and church members. The remaining spots become open to the public on February 4, 2025. **Child must be classroom age by August 31st, 2025, or December 31st, 2025, for TK**

Tuitions for 2025/2026: \$320.00 for 2-year-old classes, \$300 for 3-year-old classes, \$350.00 for 4-year-old & PK class and \$360 for TK class. Tuition is due on the 1st of the month, with September's tuition along with the supply fee of \$55, and is due on May 1st, 2025.

- CIC Preschool is not equipped to teach children with special needs.
- All 3-, 4- & 5-year-old children must be toilet trained by the first day of class.



Finance Page

Back in December, a letter from the Church Council shared the budget deficit we faced at that point. After a robust response from the congregation, we are now in a strong financial position as we enter the 3rd quarter of our fiscal year. YTD gifts brought in \$265.7k (\$74.3k in Decembre alone) which is right on target vs our budget. Preschool Revenues are at \$68.6k (\$13.1k in December) and registration has opened for summer Camps. Registration for the next school year will begin soon. Total Revenues YTD stand at \$329.8k. In the spending side, December saw regular maintenance expenses, Fire/Security maintenance (\$300), AC System maintenance (\$900), Utilities - Electricity (\$1.8k due to cold temps), mileage reimbursement (\$500), Pastor substitute fees (\$200), fees to Guest Musicians (\$275). YTD Expenses are \$340.3k (December total of \$56.4k). As a result of the generous response from Members, we have reduced our previous Deficit to \$4k, and we are on track to close the gap completely in the coming months. Please review your year end giving statements and attached pastoral letter which will be arriving soon in the mail. ~Madalyn Wilkinson, Finance Director
