From the Pastors......

"That the whole Bible were painted on our houses." – Martin Luther

You don't have to be able to read. Long before mastery of the alphabet, let alone figuring out what sounds are created when different vowels and consonants are combined, if a story has pictures associated with it, children can typically grasp a general understanding of what the story is about.

This is one of the big reasons why Martin Luther was an advocate for keeping stained glass windows in worship spaces. During Luther's time, it wasn't just children who were unable to read – most of the population was illiterate. As such, having stained glass windows in sanctuaries that depicted important biblical passages was quite helpful in communicating the Gospel story to the people. But not everyone shared Luther's perspective. There were segments within the Reformation who viewed things like stained glass windows, icons, and ornate sanctuaries as idolatrous distractions from God. As such, they removed such items from churches, sometimes through force and destruction. Many of the modern-day churches and denominations who trace their roots back to those reformers maintain very basic worship spaces today: simple pews/chairs, no vestments, no paraments, and definitely no stained-glass windows.

Along with the educational element, Luther believed that the beauty of the stained-glass was a way to further honor and glorify God. Sure, Luther was not aspiring to build a Protestant equivalent of Notre Dame Cathedral, but he saw the value in the way the windows could enhance worship and aid in peoples' understanding of the Bible.

Here at CIC, our sanctuary has the beautiful stained-glass cross which helps to center us every time we step into the sanctuary. The sanctuary also has a lot of blank, usable wall space. Shortly after our arrival at CIC, conversation on what we could do with the beige walls began happening in various circles within the church. Everyone seemed enthusiastic about doing *something* with the walls, but not really sure *what* should be done. Ideas of stained-glass occasionally arose, however, the cost and practicality of that just was not there. The focus then shifted to banners and yet that brought more and more questions – there are so many styles, so many colors to choose from... Eventually, the idea arose to have banners created based off of the stained glass windows in the Spirit Center. Because of high-quality images and printing technologies, this was a possibility. As the idea was being floated within the Altar Guild and Church Council, the family of Mildred Edwards, a member of CIC who joined the Church Triumphant earlier this year, asked if there were any needs within the church for a memorial gift. This idea was shared with them and they generously gifted the banners to the glory of God in memory of Mildred.

The banners debuted on Easter Sunday and will be dedicated on May 19th. There is no denying their beauty! And far more important than that, the banners have "painted" the walls with powerful images from scripture. May these banners help all worshippers, those who can read and those who are still learning, grow in their knowledge and love of God.

Finance Team

March gifts brought in \$58.3k, a strong result, and what we typically see in a month of Easter. YTD we are at \$382.2k of member contributions, 3% behind the Budget. Other Revenues were \$5.2k this month. Of that amount, \$2.5k was from Thrivent Choice, which continues to surpass our expectations. Thank you for directing your Thrivent Choice dollars to CIC! We also earned \$2.1k of interest income from a recently matured CD. Preschool headcount stands at 51, we continue to enroll for summer camps and for the next school year (currently 42 pre-registered), we have spots in the PK/TK, 4yo, and 2yo classes for next year. Total Revenues for the month were \$78.9k, YTD \$520.9k. On the Expense side, we paid Synod Convention fees for the Pastors (\$342),Pastor Substitute (\$275), CIC Softball team registration fee (\$260), Fire/Security inspections (\$1.4k), Landscaping (\$1.4k), quarterly refill of paper products (\$332), electricity (\$1.9k), Online streaming fees (\$384). Total expenses for the month were \$59.9, YTD \$526.1k. Our combined deficit is down to \$5.2k. We are making progress. It is worth pointing out that YTD we have contributed \$35.7k up to the Synod. Synod Benevolence, 10% of all our gifts, is one of the largest expenses for the Congregation. Bishop Tim mentioned on 4/21/24 how important our contribution is to all the combined initiatives the Synod is able to achieve, from the Seminary, University, Camp Agape and Lutheran Services Carolinas. You all have a hand in that. Thank you!
