From the Pastors.....

Unless I am convinced by the testimony of the Scriptures or by clear reason ... I am bound by the Scriptures I have quoted and my conscience is captive to the Word of God. I cannot and I will not retract anything, since it is neither safe nor right to go against conscience. I cannot do otherwise, here I stand, may God help me. Amen.

-Martin Luther, Speech at the Diet of Worms

Happy Anniversary! What, didn't you remember??? That's OK. Some milestones are easier to overlook than others...and it wasn't all that long ago that a big, similar celebration occurred.

In 2017, across the Synod, ELCA, and the world there were lots of special studies, worship services, initiatives, and parties in recognition of the 500th anniversary of the Reformation. Now, 5 years later, an integral part of the Reformation turns 500...the printing of Luther's German edition of the New Testament.

While not every part of the Reformation warrants a separate anniversary recognition, Luther's work in translating the Bible into a language that ordinary people could actually read deserves our attention. Like so many modern-day realities, it is easy to take for granted things we do and experience that other generations could have never imagined. The Bible, the Word of God, is literally everywhere today and that's not even an exaggeration. They are in our homes, hospital rooms, and even in most hotel rooms we find ourselves in. In addition to those places, we can download the Bible onto our phones via dozens of apps enabling us to easily carry God's Word with us wherever we go.

That kind of availability is an extraordinary blessing. And yet, having direct access to God's promises is still relatively new in the life of the church. Prior to Luther's translation efforts, for the first 1500 years or so of Christianity, scripture was only read and interpreted by biblical scholars and priests. This lack of accessibility for ALL people greatly upset Luther and he felt the church was hoarding a means to connect to Christ more deeply.

As such, Luther spent years working to make sure people could read scripture just like he and the rest of the priesthood could. Luther knew firsthand just how powerful directly encountering God's Word could be, because it was in Luther's studying of scripture that he was awakened to the message of God's grace – a message that gave him the courage to risk his life and spark the Reformation.

The unfortunate reality regarding this 500th anniversary is how infrequently we read scripture even with God's Word now literally accessible at our fingertips wherever we are. This is not an altogether new tendency, but regardless of what previous generations did or did not do, God's promises of grace and life are ours to read, reflect, and, as scripture says, inwardly digest.

Diving into studying scripture can be intimidating, and we know the various studies happening at CIC may not be at a time that work for you. If you're eager to begin a more structured time of reading scripture, God Pause, out of Luther Seminary in Minnesota, is a great resource to build some momentum. If you are curious about other options/opportunities, please let us know.

We're not sure what one typically gets for a 500th anniversary (chocolate, roses, even diamonds don't seem appropriate for a milestone like that). With this particular anniversary, what we should do seems pretty obvious...and if you already have a meaningful and disciplined time studying God's Word, then perhaps your challenge is to help others discover how powerful reading about God's promises can be. Happy Anniversary! And, Happy Reading!

From the Finance Team

August brought \$39.9k in financial gifts. Year to date we are at \$89.9k in contributions, 17% of the Budget, which is right on track at this point of the fiscal year. In August the Preschool wrapped up a successful summer of fully enrolled camps, and they have now started the new school year with 58 students. On the expense side, we saw several items of routine spending: electrical work to replace broken fixtures, flooring work to replace baseboard and loose tiles, security system maintenance, renewal of liturgical book subscriptions, etc. As everyone has surely noticed, we had the parking lot repaved, which cost \$10,5k. This expense was fully paid, but for reporting purposes, it was placed in a restricted account in anticipation of being later offset by the ERC refund money, when it eventually arrives. As far as the ERC filing status, we are still in a holding pattern, just as we are hearing many other companies are. The IRS is swamped with regular and covid relief related filings, and they are taking an unusually long time to work through everything. Bottomline for August, we have a \$4.9k surplus at this point of the fiscal year.
