From the Pastors.....

When the disciples had rowed about three or four miles, they saw Jesus walking on the sea and coming near the boat, and they were terrified. But he said to them, "It is I; do not be afraid." Then they wanted to take him into the boat, and immediately the boat reached the land toward which they were going.

John 6:19-21

Rowing Forward

Rowing is a difficult thing to do. Not that either one of us has vast experiences in a rowboat. Virtually all our time rowing has been on cardio machines in gyms. Although, the handful of times out on the water have given us deep respect for those who do row because it takes a significant amount of strength, endurance, coordination, and awareness to accomplish it.

The odd thing with rowboats, as opposed to canoes or kayaks, is that the rowers sit with their backs facing the direction they want to go. The positioning is awkward at best. But that configuration is how one generates the most force and speed to get to the desired destination. And, in observing where one has been, one has an immensely helpful point of reference.

The disciples were caught in a storm as they were out rowing on the sea. It was far from an optimal situation. And as they were looking backwards to where they had come from, in an earnest attempt to row forward, their gaze fell upon Christ. The unusual situation was frightening and confusing for them. Recognizing their dismay, Jesus offered them his reassurance and presence. In practically no time at all, they all then reached their destination.

This storm we have been in has certainly been disorienting. And while we are likely a good way out from being completely through it, the last few months have hopefully helped us all gather our bearings a bit. And as we assess our current positions, the reality has likely hit that reverting right back to where we were before the pandemic, whether it be as individuals, families, communities, or as a congregation is not an option. The world has changed. We have changed. **But we can move forward.** Looking towards where we have been gives us a powerful perspective as we do just that. And, when we gaze back, we also see Christ. Christ is who gives us peace and strength and trust and hope to move somewhere that we cannot completely see right now.

Alongside Council leadership, we are excited to have begun the process of visioning where the Spirit is leading this family of faith. We anticipate more details about these conversations to be forthcoming as the programming year is set to begin in September. And while we don't anticipate that we will reach our desired destination(s) (whatever they may be!) nearly as quickly as the disciples did, we will get there. And those longed for results won't come from purely our own strength, endurance, coordination, or awareness. This kind of rowing is *hard* work. We are going to need each other's help to pull it off. And, most of all, we will need to keep our eyes fixed on Christ throughout the venture. That perspective, and his guidance, is ultimately what will lead us forward.


