Welcome, Reverend Dr. Marcus Miller!
Pastor Miller will lead CIC in worship on Sunday, August 17th.

Pastor Miller was born and raised in Southgate, MI (a Detroit suburb) where his father was a Lutheran pastor and his mother an elementary school teacher. He served in five calls from 1971-2012: teacher of religion and German at Martin Luther High School in Maspeth, New York (1971-73), Pastor of Immanuel Lutheran Church, Mt. Vernon, NY (1973-79), Pastor of the Lutheran Church of the Good Shepherd, Brooklyn, OH (1979-95), Bishop of the Northeastern Ohio Synod, ELCA (1995-2006), and President of the Lutheran Theological Southern Seminary, Columbia, SC (2006-12) while Pastor Lisa and Pastor Michael were students. From November 1, 2013 until August 31, 2014, he was the Interim Bishop of the Northeastern Ohio Synod upon Bishop Eaton's election as Presiding Bishop of the ELCA. He has served numerous congregational interims in his retirement including here at CIC. Pastor Miller supports and encourages various ministries of social justice and compassion both during his time as a parish pastor and a synod bishop and now in retirement. Pastor Miller and his wife, Katherine, a retired Registered Nurse and Middle School Band Director, live in Huntersville. They have two children and five grandchildren they are happy to share about!

Road Trip! Summertime is when those iconic adventures typically take place, which has made the theme for VBS this year extra relatable for the kids (and for the many amazing adult and youth helpers, too).

All the brilliant decorations, creative snacks, and clever crafts hearkened back memories for us of bygone journeys across highways and interstates. Those ventures of cruising down the open road while sipping on an ice-cold drink from a gas station and simultaneously attempting to belt out the lyrics to your carefully crafted playlist...good times, right?! The rush of freedom, excitement, and anticipation those reflections created were tangible.

And then, one of the VBS stations, appropriately labelled, "Road Construction," made us literally laugh out loud. That station's symbolism didn't bring back nearly as fond feelings and emotions from past trips. It's hard not to see orange cones, helmeted workers, and flashing yellow lights and not experience some frustration, disappointment, anxiety, and perhaps even anger. But, construction (delays & detours) are inevitable parts of road trips. No matter how well you prepared for the experience, or what the AAA TripTik says, or what Google Maps advises, something will impact it. So, we were encouraged to see that the curriculum included this symbolism within the Road Trip theme because such trips rarely, if ever, are completely smooth sailing.

The reoccurring hope-filled message of the week, and of our faith, is that God journeys with us. Whether we are happily cruising along with our windows down, slurping on a Coke and enjoying our favorite tunes as we eagerly anticipate what lies ahead, or if we find ourselves in stand-still traffic with no AC and are about to run out of gas, we've always got someone riding shotgun with us.

That presence of God is what enables us, like the Israelites, to be strong and courageous. At the beginning of the book of Joshua, they were on the precipice of entering the promised land after arguably the most epic road trip ever. And, understandably, they were experiencing a lot of emotions about it. There was no clear map or travel itinerary to outline their next steps, but God promised to be with them and would guide and encourage them along the way.

While Road Trips can be loads of fun, they can be a lot of other things, too. Throughout the tasty snacks, caffeinated beverages, mediocre pop music AND the headache inducing delays, the extra-out-of-the-way detours, the car trouble...God is with us. Forever and always. What a wonderful thing for our VBS participants to learn. What a wonderful thing for all of us to be reminded of.

ELCA Churchwide Assembly

At the publishing of this newsletter, the ELCA Churchwide Assembly is currently taking place in Phoenix, AZ. The ELCA Churchwide Assembly, the primary decision-making body of the church, is a process of communal spiritual discernment. When the ELCA Churchwide Assembly convenes, its voting members meet with confidence in God's grace around word and water, wine and bread, to carry on their work on behalf of the entire church. A big focus of this assembly will be the election of a new presiding bishop and secretary.

But additionally, during this week, voting members:

- Hear reports and review the work of churchwide officers, leaders and units;
 - Receive and consider proposals from synod assemblies;
- Elect officers, board members and other leaders as specified by the constitution or bylaws;
 - Establish ELCA churchwide policy;
 - Worship together;
 - Adopt a budget; and
- Conduct other business related to the ELCA churchwide organization.

Fourteen voting members from our NC Synod, along with a few staff and visitors, are part of this gathering of some 1,200 Lutherans. The gathering occurs under the theme of "For the Life of the World."

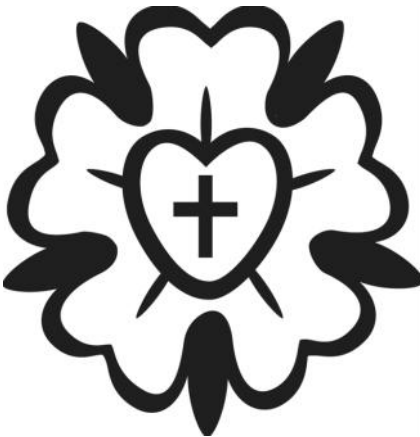
Sunday School Teachers Needed

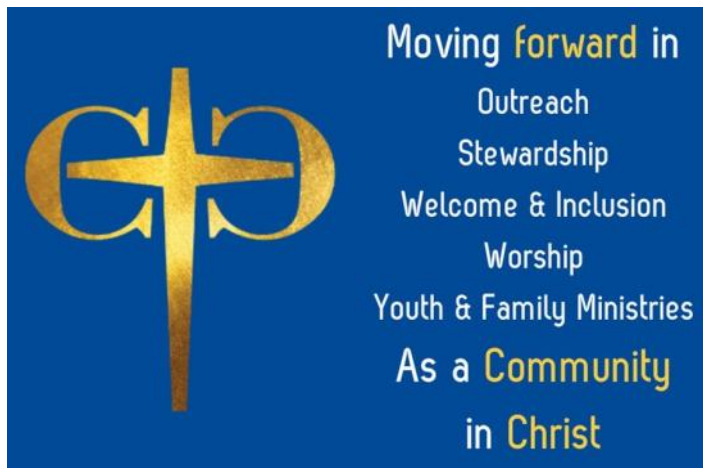
Finance Page

We wrapped up the fiscal year 2024-25 with total Contributions of \$572.9k, ahead of our Budget goal due to both special gifts and consistently strong current giving. We appreciate the Congregation Members' responsiveness to the financial appeal. We are also ahead of our April full-year projection because of strong results in both May and June. Other Revenues came to a total of \$25.3, and were most recently boosted by the receipt in June of the long awaited final refund related to the ERC covid relief filing. Our Preschool wrapped up the year a little behind the Budget due to lower enrollment, which we have been communicating throughout the year. Even with that, they were able to contribute approx. \$10k of profits to the final congregational bottom line. Total Revenues were \$740.7k (4% ahead of the Budget). On the expense side, we are mostly in line. The areas where we saw a couple of overages were in Family Life, where we settled the bills for the Women's Retreat from last March, Insurance, as our Premiums were about \$2k higher than we expected, and Synod Convention, as we had more participants this year due to Bishop Tim's retirement and bishop election. Total Expenses for the year \$720.5k. 1% higher than budgeted. We end the year with a \$20.2k Surplus which, together with the ERC money received (\$27k after filing fees), will be divided into the following parts: 10% additional benevolence to the Synod, 10% designated for local outreach, and 80% retained for internal needs and repairs. We also anticipate receiving the settlement from the DOT land sale, and those funds will be primarily used to replenish the Emergency/Capital Expenditures fund as well as to provide for any possible hardship from upcoming road construction. Please reach out to me with any additional questions about our financial results.
