On August 4th, several of CIC's SR High students returned from their week at SparkDwell with full hearts and tired bodies. SparkDwell seeks to provide participants with an immersive and educational experience centered around relationship-building, education, storytelling, and service alongside those who are currently or formerly homeless. We are immensely blessed to have been a part of this ministry and through all the ways we got to experience God at work in the marginalized communities of Winston-Salem. Below, you will find personal reflections from the participants about their time on the trip.



Ivor Daly, Senior: SparkDwell was an amazing opportunity! Too often these days, I see the word of God being used to back acts of bigotry and unreasonable phobia for certain groups of people, the homeless included. In contrast to what I see and hear from the Internet, I got to participate in activities and meet real people who were working to develop their self-mastery through Christ. Interacting with them, I noticed that each of their lives is its own testament to how much influence God can extract from even the most disadvantaged groups of people. To be blunt, I never expected there could be such faith or depth of character in homeless people. Coming into that week, that was all I labeled them as, but living with them made me realize that their lives are much more nuanced than that. Take my altercation with the lady who pretended to be a property owner, for example. You don't realize people can be that wretched until you live it. In spite of their circumstances, seeing how they



Marshall Blackwell, Senior: Spending my week at SparkDwell among the homeless and those less fortunate showed me the value that people place in God and the sense of community he brings. Everyone greeted each other, was more or less friendly, and wished each other well. One man, who went by Booker, shared how going through life remembering God during the dark times we face allowed us to truly appreciate the good things we experience. The time I spent at SparkDwell has been taken to heart, and I often dwell on how hard it is to just be seen as human when homeless.



Cade Poovey, Junior: When I look back at this experience with the SparkDwell organization, I think of many specific occasions in which I saw God and the overall compassion of everyone involved with the trip. The first experience which I felt was really eye opening was on the first full day when we walked around Winston-Salem with our counselor, performing various tasks that homeless people would have to perform on a daily basis. Walking around in the community, taking the bus, and performing the tasks gave me a greater understanding of what the homeless go through every day. At one instance, a stranger got very aggressive and hostile, but our counselor calmed him down and smoothed out the situation. I felt that this moment showed compassion and God, as he fixed a bad situation and made it better with kindness. I also saw God in several other

instances as we helped people in the homeless community. Whether it was passing out food, buying clothes, or anything else, I could see God as everyone selflessly put forward their efforts in order to help others. Overall, this trip was extremely eye opening and I'm the actions of helping out the community, I saw God present in many ways.



JJ McNeilis, Junior: When I envisioned what a mission trip to help the homeless looked like, I pictured dirty angry people. It turns out they were really nice and helpful. I saw God at work through the connection they all had with each other within their homeless community. My favorite part was when we prepared many meals in the food pantry for the homeless people. I really thought the experience was



Hayden Gulzow, Junior: I have a lot of feelings and thoughts coming out of this trip some good and some not as good, and sure I could complain about every minute detail from the moments during the days that we did nothing to their barely being anything for me to eat, but I realized something while trying to write this, none of that mattered, I didn't go there to have fun I went there to help and learn about the homeless community there and that's where this trip really exceeded my expectation. Everyone we met from the community of people were all so informative and serious with their experiences of homelessness current and in the past but were also so kind and welcoming throughout the whole experience. 


National Youth Gathering

Finance Team

We had a very lean month in July. Financial gifts brought in \$34.4k. This appears to be due to many families in the Congregation being away on summer trips. Preschool camp brought in \$4.4k and our Other Revenues added \$700 (bank interest and facility use). Total Revenues this month were \$39.5k

No unusual expenses this month. We paid a quarterly installment of our Insurance fees (\$4.4k), and renewed the annual license for Music and Video subscriptions (\$700). Total Expenses came to \$53k.

We are ending the first month of the fiscal year with a Deficit of \$13.5k.

As was briefly mentioned during a recent Sunday service, we have finally collected the last portion of the Covid relief related ERC claim from the IRS. The total of all our filed and collected claims to date came to \$115.9k, plus we received \$5.4k of additional interest income due to the long time elapsed since the filing. As a reminder, we paid \$13.2k for preparation and filing fees, which leaves us with net proceeds of \$102.8k. These funds will be used to replenish our Capital/Emergency account (\$60k), \$4.3k will be sent to the NC Synod as a Congregational tithe, and \$4.3k will be used for local outreach programs. The remaining \$34.2k will be set aside to support daily Church/Congregation needs that are not of emergency nature. ~Madalyn Wilkinson, Director of Finance.
