### From the Pastors......

6Jesus said to them, "They need not go away; you give them something to eat." 17They replied, "We have nothing here but five loaves and two fish." 18And he said, "Bring them here to me." 19Then he ordered the crowds to sit down on the grass. Taking the five loaves and the two fish, he looked up to heaven, and blessed and broke the loaves, and gave them to the disciples, and the disciples gave them to the crowds. 20And all ate and were filled; and they took up what was left over of the broken pieces, twelve baskets full. 21And those who ate were about five thousand men, besides women and children. Matthew 14:16-21

Feeding people is almost always a challenge. Menu planning, in and of itself, can be a major feat. When you factor in actually preparing the food, serving the food, and the cleanup afterwards...it's a lot. And whenever more people are involved, the difficulty is literally multiplied.

The story of the feeding of the 5,000 is found in all 4 Gospels, which is a rarity, and likely speaks to the impact and importance of the event. John's version of the feeding was the Gospel lesson for the 10th Sunday after Pentecost. One of the details that John didn't emphasize as much as Matthew was the disciples' role in the feeding. In Matthew, the disciples are specifically mentioned as the distributors of the food. They didn't come with the ingredients, according to John, a boy did that. They didn't do any of the miraculous preparation, Jesus did that. Their job was to simply take the generosity of the boy, along with the blessings of Jesus, to the people. That's it. It's not that their role was insignificant - it was actually crucial for the many people to be able to eat. Moreso, their job was not overly complicated as they just needed to pass on what was given to them to the people.

We've been thinking a lot about this role of the disciples as we are now sandwiched between the ELCA's National Youth Gathering and CIC's Camp Firelight VBS. While the scale of these two impactful youth ministries is certainly different, they each involve the desire to feed a lot of people – not just with stadium food or gummy worms in dirt pudding, but with the goodness of God. And because of the work of great leadership with both events and God's blessings showering over them, there is abundant spiritual food available. But, in order for people to be fed by it, those distributors become essential!

In many instances, these "distributors" are called volunteers. And whether it's a spiritual meal for 16,000 people or 30, distributors are crucial. They may not have put in the hours organizing anything, they certainly are not transforming it into something beyond what God has already made it to be, but they are the means through which others can receive that nourishing gift of God.

With immensely grateful hearts, we give thanks for the thousands of volunteers at the Gathering and the dozens of servants here for CIC's VBS...because of their efforts, so many are getting to taste and see the love and grace of Jesus in powerful ways this summer. We are also thankful for the faithful distributors who readily take Jesus out into the world each and every week, ready to extend the nourishing gift of compassion, justice, and love to the people they encounter. We don't have to pick this food out. We don't have to make it. We do get to share it. Thanks be to God!

CIC will be co-hosting a trip following some of Paul's footsteps, Journeys of Paul in Greece, through "Educational Opportunities Tours" (EO Tours) in partnership with Huntersville United Methodist Church (HUMC). We will have our own registration process through CIC, but our partnership with HUMC will allow us to benefit from the knowledge HUMC has gleaned from past EO Tours and enable us to travel as a larger group of neighbors both through the air and on the busses.

#### Finance Team

June brought us to the end of the fiscal year 2023-24. After a rough start and a couple of Council appeals, I am thrilled to report that we have closed the contribution gap and ended the year "in the black". A huge 'thank you' to all those who were able to adjust their giving to our new inflation-impacted reality. And, as always, we appreciate all Members who faithfully continue to support this congregation. June financial gifts brought in \$51.9k, We ended the full fiscal year with \$527.7k in Member Contributions, which is only 0.5% behind the Budget. Other Revenues brought in \$3.7k this month, between bank interest, Thrivent Choice money, credit card rewards, and facility use fees. Total for the year was \$26.8k. This is an area of strength for us, and we urge you to continue to designate those Choice Dollars to CIC as able. The Preschool continues full steam with summer camps. Camp Tuition brought in \$10.2k in June, for a full year total of \$18.9k. Along with regular Monthly Tuition and other fees, total Preschool Revenues were \$157.6k this year. This is lower than we budgeted for last year, however, with implementing various cost cutting measures and with relying on fundraising to cover a good portion of classroom expenses, the Preschool was still able to bring \$19.5k of profits to the Congregation. We are still actively registering students for the next school year. Please, spread the word! We have openings in the 4s, PK and TK classes. Total Revenues for the month were \$66k, full year total \$7112.1k. On the Expense side, we saw typical, routine items this month. Pastor Substitute (\$200), Lay Pastors Ministry (\$270), Office Supplies (\$270), Mileage Reimbursement (\$750), VBS volunteer background checks (\$300), YE Sunday School activities (\$200), YE Middle School Activities (\$400). We accrued for the upcoming carpet shampooing service (\$3.2k), as well as painting, repairs to the fob security system and WiFi (\$3k). Additionally, we were able to set aside unused funds previously budgeted for the National Youth Gathering, as we had sufficient money from fundraising. The leftover funds (\$2k) will be used to help cover the cost of the next Campfirmation class. June Operating Expenses were \$65.2k, full year total of \$710.1k. We ended the year with a Surplus of \$2k. Again, a massive 'thank you' to all Members for their continued, faithful support. We are now moving into the NEW fiscal year and starting with a clean slate. Summer months always tend to be lean, as many will take various summer trips, and sending a gift is maybe not front and center on everyone's mind. We encourage Members to explore the different remote ways of giving that make it easy and convenient to keep supporting CIC even when away from home.~ Madalyn Wilkinson,
